
Molori Safari is recognised throughout the world as one of South Africa's ultra-luxurious hideaways set in one of the most breath-taking natural landscapes.

The Lodge

The exclusive lodge, renowned for its bold and eclectic aesthetic, features high fashion interiors and an expertly curated art experience, unexpected in the African bush.

Bespoke, contemporary furniture, designed and made locally by award winning Anatomy Design compliment iconic furniture pieces such as the Fendi Casa chaises longues and the Philipp Plein swing beds which have been at the lodge since inception.

Ethiopian beaded armchairs, antique Chinese cabinets, and vintage Louis Vuitton bar cabinets are blended with layers of rich, textured fabrics in colours that complement the Madikwe landscape.

The entire lodge has floor to ceiling glass retractable doors that allow the sounds and scents of the African bush to drift through. Guests have magnificent views from every angle of the lodge, overlooking the expansive valley and mountain range.

Several relaxation and dining areas overlook the lodge's waterhole which has a luxury hide with an adjoining gin & whiskey bar, a spa, a stargazing observatory with a retractable roof and many viewing decks to enjoy the spectacular views.

The Suites

All suites have floor-to-ceiling retractable glass doors, which fold away completely, connecting each suite's interior to a private deck and infinity pool.

All feature indoor and outdoor showers, as well as free-standing baths, custom furniture, indoor/outdoor dining options, fireplaces, minibars and air-conditioning.

Both presidential suites follow the indoor/ outdoor style of the other suites but on a much grander scale. Each has a kitchen and dining area, additional guest bathrooms, a walk-in dressing room and a study.



Due to the suites being so well placed, many couples and families who visit the lodge enjoy absolute privacy.



Sephiri Premier Suite

Sephiri means 'secret' in Sesotho



The three premier suites, all with large decks, infinity pools and large glass ceiling to floor doors, open to views overlooking the expansive valley and mountain range.

The Sephiri suite is a two-bedroomed suite with en-suite bathrooms and a view over the Molori waterhole. It's an ideal suite for families or four adults sharing.

Lesedi Premier Suite

Lesedi means 'light' in Sesotho



Lesedi epitomises comfort and elegance, featuring contemporary handcrafted African pieces such as the hanging bedroom chandelier. The suite's lounge is separated from the bedroom by a cylindrical floor-to-ceiling stone-clad fireplace, while the retractable glass walls give way to a large terrace with a private infinity pool and stunning views.





The Spa

Our spa, voted as South Africa's most romantic, offers guests a tranquil environment in which to submerge in the natural sounds and scents of the African bush. It has an intimate indoor treatment room and an outdoor massage deck where guests can soak up the natural rhythms of nature.







The spa has a large steam room, Nordic sauna overlooking an inviting chiller pool as well as a fully equipped gym. After a tough workout or a relaxing treatment, the large spa deck is the perfect place to relax or enjoy yoga outdoors.




Stargazing

The lodge has an observatory with a fully retractable roof which is equipped with one of the largest privately owned telescopes in Southern Africa – a 16" Meade Schmidt Cassegrain, allowing guests to explore the cosmos and the Southern Hemisphere's remarkable night sky.

Madikwe Game Reserve is the perfect spot for serene stargazing. Easily spotted star formations include the Southern Cross, the enchanting Milky Way, Orion the Hunter, Scorpius, Leo, Pegasus and Jewel Box cluster among others.







At Molori the stargazing experience is led by the qualified guides who are all knowledgeable about the Southern African night sky and are also great story tellers.

Apart from sharing their knowledge of the constellations, their story telling extends to fascinating information about traditional African astronomy and folklore.

The best time to experience the magical southern hemisphere's night sky is from autumn into winter when the skies are clear.


On Safari

Conservation

The Ichikowitz family is passionate and committed to the conservation of wildlife. Through Molori lodge operations and the Ichikowitz Family Foundation, they facilitate and contribute to many conservation projects not just in South Africa but across the continent.

We offer conservation experiences which include wildlife notching in the Madikwe Game Reserve and K9 experiences at our 'conservation' lodge – Moledi Gorge. The funds generated from these experiences go towards the ongoing conservation of wildlife in the game reserve.









The family-owned property portfolio – Rora Private Collection – has expanded in the past few years from only Molori Safari – to include uber chic Moledi Gorge, in the North West Province; On Oyster, a beach villa in Boggomsbaai on South Africa's garden route, and a new luxury tented camp is being developed in the World Heritage Site of Mana Pools in Zimbabwe.

The selection of properties offers guests a unique luxury travel circuit of bush and beach, including adventure travel and conservation experiences.



Moledi Gorge

Moledi is an eight-suite sanctuary, situated on one of the most picturesque, privately owned game farms, north of Magaliesburg in the North West Province, South Africa.

This uber-chic bush villa, built high on a cliff, has breath taking views of an expansive gorge, which can be enjoyed from every angle.

The lodge has seven premier suites and one presidential suite.

All have private balconies and floor to ceiling glass doors that offer magnificent views.



Guests get to enjoy an infinity pool and a choice of indoor and outdoor dining areas including a hammock garden and two bomas. The lodge has an intimate wine cellar with a private dining area.


An intimate spa environment comprising one treatment room and a steam room provides a tranquil setting for relaxing treatments.

Moledi is known as our conservation lodge and offers guests an opportunity to experience an on-the-ground K9 demonstration and learn about the role handlers and their dogs play in the fight against rhino and elephant poaching across the African continent.

This is a great experience combined with a rhino notching activity at Molori Safari.








On Oyster

On Oyster is a seven-suite beach villa situated in a small seaside village called Bagumbayan (Boggomsbaai), on the Garden Route.

It is perfectly positioned between Cape Town and Knysna, just a 30-minute drive south of Mossel Bay.

The villa has breath taking ocean views on an untouched beach that stretches for miles.
